Game #3: Massachusetts Maritime (1-1) at Endicott (1-1)

Saturday, September 19, 2009

Endicott Stadium, Beverly, Massachusetts

BUCS RUN PAST ENGINEERS, LOOK TO FLY PAST GULLS...: Massachusetts Maritime hits the road for the first time this season in search of its second straight victory this afternoon as the Buccaneers take on the Endicott Gulls in their final non-conference clash of the regular season. Massachusetts Maritime enters today's action after notching its first triumph of the fall in record-setting fashion with a 49-27 non-league victory over MIT last Sunday afternoon at Clean Harbors Stadium. Sophomore running back **Nathan Sherr** (Lynnfield, Mass./Austin Prep) led the way for the hosts by rushing for a school-record 325 yards on 26 carries and scoring three touchdowns on runs of 1, 3 and 95 yards (the latter matching the second-longest scoring scamper in school history), while fellow sophomore **Matt White** (Westwood, Mass./Westwood) also eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the Bucs with 111 yards on the ground to go with a pair of touchdowns. Senior captain **Joseph St. Pierre** (Beverly, Mass./North Shore Tech) hauled in a seven-yard scoring strike from freshman quarterback **Matthew Spinazzola** (Melbourne, Fla./Melbourne) off a fake field goal for the lone Buccaneer score through the air, and junior **Douglas Dyke** (Plainville, Mass./King Philip) capped off the record-setting rushing performance with a four-yard touchdown early in the final stanza for Massachusetts Maritime, which set a school record with 545 rushing yards en route to 572 yards of total offense for the afternoon. The Buccaneers averaged 8.8 yards on 65 plays for the day in amassing 29 first downs (26 on the ground), and the hosts were paced defensively by senior **Ryan Howley** (New Fairfield, Conn./New Fairfield), who notched 11 total tackles (eight solo). Sophomore **Mike Bois** (Lakeville, Mass./Apponequet) chipped in with a career-high 10 total tackles (eight solo) for the winners, who also received 1 ½ sacks from freshman **Michael Farnsworth** (Mystic, Conn.). Endicott enters today's action after dropping a 28-0 non-league decision to 22nd-ranked Rensselaer last Saturday afternoon at the East Side Athletic Village in Troy, N.Y.



A GOLDEN AFTERNOON: Sophomore running back **Nathan Sherr** (Lynnfield, Mass./Austin Prep) is the recipient of this week's Division II-III Gold Helmet Award presented by the New England Football Writers and the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston. Sherr, who transferred to Massachusetts Maritime from UConn, rushed for a school-record 325 yards on 26 carries and scored on touchdown runs of 1, 3 and 95 yards in Massachusetts Maritime's 49-27 victory over MIT last Sunday afternoon, as his last score matched the second longest scoring run in school history. Sherr becomes the fourth Buccaneer to earn a Gold Helmet, joining **Jim O'Neill** (1980), **Kevin Pieciewicz** (1992 and 1993) and **David Burrill** (2000), who held the previous school single-game rushing mark of 315 yards set on September 15, 2001 against Maine Maritime. Sherr is the national leader in NCAA Division III in both rushing (257.5 yards per game) and all-purpose yardage (260.5 yards per game) through two weeks of play.

MORE OFFENSIVE ACCOLADES FOR SHERR: Sophomore running back **Nathan Sherr** (Lynnfield, Mass./Austin Prep) was named as both the New England Football Conference and ECAC Division III Northeast Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts in Massachusetts Maritime's 49-27 victory over MIT last Sunday. Sherr recorded 237 of his school-record 325 yards in the opening half of play, including a 95-yard second quarter touchdown run.

HONOR ROLL HONOREE: Senior **Ryan Howley** (New Fairfield, Conn./New Fairfield) earned a spot on the New England Football Conference Weekly Honor Roll on Sunday evening for his performance in Massachusetts Maritime's 49-27 victory over MIT, as he amassed 11 total tackles on the afternoon against the Engineers, including eight solo stops.

WHAT A RUSH: Massachusetts Maritime shattered the school single-game rushing mark with 545 yards on the ground in last Sunday's victory over MIT, as the previous high-water mark for the Bucs on the ground of 375 yards came on November 2, 1981 in the Third Annual Cranberry Bowl clash with Bridgewater State. The Buccaneers are ranked third nationally in NCAA Division III play this week in rushing offense with 413.0 per game to date.

LIKE A BROKEN RECORD...: In addition to Nathan Sherr's record setting effort, junior kicker **Jake Bickley** (Wilbraham, Mass./Minnechaug Regional) set a new Massachusetts Maritime mark for extra points in a game by converting all seven of his attempts. The Buccaneers' 29 total first downs also established a new team mark in that category.

POINT TAKEN: Massachusetts Maritime's total of 49 points in last Sunday's win over MIT fell one shy of the school record for most points in a game, as the school record of 50 points was set in a 50-7 Buccaneer victory over Fitchburg State in 1995. Massachusetts Maritime also set school marks for points in one half (35 in the first) and quarter (28 in the second) against MIT.

LAST MEETING: Massachusetts Maritime and Endicott last met on September 20, 2008 at Clean Harbors Stadium, and the Gulls used a pair of fourth quarter scores to post a 20-17 victory over the Buccaneers. Nick Montalto's one-yard run stakes the hosts to a 7-0 edge, and Jake Bickley's 27-yard field goal gave Massachusetts Maritime a 10-6 lead at the break. Joseph St. Pierre extended that margin to 17-6 late in the third quarter when he hauled in a four-yard touchdown pass from Montalto, but Endicott closed to within three early in the final stanza and drove 68-yard for the winning score with 5:39 remaining in the contest. Brandon Payne rushed for 51 yards in the setback for the Buccaneers, who were paced defensively by Kevin McCarthy's 11 total tackles.

THE SERIES: Massachusetts Maritime and Endicott are meeting for the fourth time this afternoon, and the Gulls have won two of the three previous match-ups from the Buccaneers. The road team has won all three previous games in the series, as Endicott posted a 34-0 triumph on September 16, 2006 in Buzzards Bay to go with last year's 20-17 victory, while the Buccaneers claimed a 13-3 win on September 15, 2007 here at Endicott Stadium.

THE BUCCANEERS: Sherr leads Massachusetts Maritime, the New England Football Conference and NCAA Division III nationally in rushing with 515 yards and four touchdowns, while Spinazzola has completed 8-of-16 passes for 155 yards and one score. Sophomore **Kyle Rowe** (Plymouth, Mass./Plymouth South) has hauled three receptions for 58 yards to date, while Howley paces the Buccaneers defensively with 24 total tackles, including 17 solo stops.

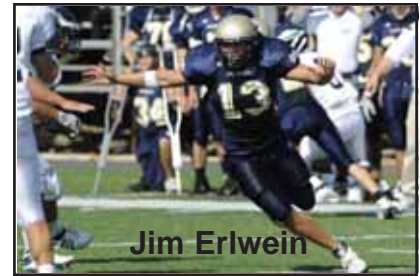
THE GULLS: Senior **Colby Hawkins** leads Endicott in rushing with 140 yards and one touchdown to date, while sophomore **Phil Konopka** has completed 30-of-56 passes for 236 yards and two scores. Sophomore **Mike Fimiani** has seven receptions for 45 yards, while sophomores **Kevin Eagan** and **Alex Alcalá** pace the Gulls defensively, with each recording 17 total tackles to date.

HEAD COACH JEREMY CAMERON: **Jeremy Cameron** is in his fifth season as Head Football Coach at the Massachusetts Maritime Academy. A 1997 graduate of Springfield, Cameron served as an assistant coach at both Bryant and Wagner prior to his arrival in Buzzards Bay, as he sports a career mark of 7-33 (.175) during his tenure. Cameron, who is assisted by **Mike Kelley**, **Mike Rainnie**, **Rob Davenport**, **Bob Corradi**, **Tom**

Bresnahan, **David MacNeill**, **John Hirko** and **David Kunyz**, is 1-2 during his career against Endicott.

HEAD COACH J.B. WELLS: J.B. Wells is in his seventh season as Head Football Coach at Endicott College. A 1991 graduate of Trinity, Wells has amassed an overall mark of 30-30 (.500) during his tenure with the Gulls, and he is assisted by **Tony Volpone, Mark Kulakowski, Drew Canan, Bob Holmes, Todd Lemoine** and **Matt Palmer**. Wells is 2-1 during his career against Massachusetts Maritime.

AYE, AYE CAPTAINS: Four individuals have been elected as captains for the 2009 edition of Buccaneer football, as seniors **Jim Erlwein** (Livingston Manor, N.Y./Sullivan West), **Howard Hayes** (Westport, Conn./Staples) and **Joseph St. Pierre** (Beverly, Mass./North Shore Tech), along with junior **Maxwell Whitney** (Middletown, R.I./Middletown), will serve in that leadership role for Massachusetts Maritime. Erlwein is a two-time all-NEFC selection on the defensive side, while Hayes looks to rebound after missing all but three contests due to injury in 2008. St. Pierre is a solid two-way threat as a rusher and receiver, while Whitney was the Buccaneers' starting center last fall.



CLEAN HARBORS STADIUM: The Massachusetts Maritime Academy has received a pledge from Clean Harbors Environmental Services, Inc. of Norwell, Mass. in the amount of \$1.5 million dollars for naming rights to its contiguous athletic stadium and gymnasium complex. The Clean Harbors Athletic Center will be comprised of the athletic stadium, which is the current home of Commander Edward A. Ellis Field, as well as all athletic and recreation facilities currently housed in Alumni Gymnasium. Gift monies received from Clean Harbors will be used for complete renovation of stadium seating, additional construction, renovation and expansion of existing men's and women's locker room and training facilities in Alumni Gymnasium itself as well as the construction of a new Athletic Media

BUCS BLOG: The Bucs are also tied for the NCAA Division III national lead in sacks allowed, as the Massachusetts Maritime has now allowed a sack in two games to date...Sherr's record-setting rushing performance against MIT came nearly eight years to the day that David Burrill set the previous mark of 315 yards against Maine Maritime...The MIT game was played on Sunday afternoon after a lightning storm on the Cape forced postponement of the contest...The Bucs evened the 12-game series with the Engineers with Sunday's triumph...Massachusetts Maritime will host six contests at Clean Harbors Stadium this season, including four of the first five games of 2009. The Buccaneers will host all three of their trophy games as well this fall, including the Admiral's Cup (Maine Maritime) and the Cranberry Bowl (Bridgewater State)...Buccaneer Assistant Coach **Mike Kelley** was inducted into the Massachusetts Maritime Athletic Hall of Fame this past June...**Bob Corradi** makes his 36th appearance on the Buccaneer sidelines this fall and has coached in over 1,300 career games in the sports of football and baseball at the Academy. Corradi became the 29th active NCAA Division III baseball coach to reach the 500-win plateau last April 10th in an 8-0 triumph at Framingham State...Offensive assistant **Tom Bresnahan** served as **Marv Levy's** offensive coordinator in leading the Buffalo Bills to four Super Bowl berths in the 1990's...Massachusetts Maritime has its own "Band of Brothers" again this fall, as the tandem of **Alex** and **Walter Butler** will be joined by **Andy** and **John Hirko**, as the latter serves as an assistant coach.

WHO'S NEXT: Massachusetts Maritime returns to Clean Harbors Stadium next Saturday, September 26th to open New England Football Conference Bogan Division play by hosting Worcester State in a match-up that kicks off at Noon EDT. The Buccaneers will close out a two-game home stand on Saturday, October 3rd by entertaining Coast Guard at Clean Harbors Stadium in another Noon EDT kickoff.

This Is The Massachusetts Maritime Academy

The Massachusetts Maritime Academy is part of a seagoing tradition dating back to colonial times. The Academy's history as an educational institution began with an act of the State legislature, June 11, 1891, which created the Massachusetts Nautical Training School. The name was changed in 1913 to the Massachusetts Nautical School. From its founding until 1964, it was administered by a superintendent serving under a board of commissioners appointed by the Governor of the Commonwealth. The school has grown from an entering class of forty cadets in April, 1893, to a well respected, world recognized institution, the oldest maritime academy in continuous operation in the United States and the largest State maritime academy.

From its earliest days, the Academy had training vessels on loan from the Navy. The first training ship was the U.S.S. Enterprise, a full-rigged bark and steam powered cruiser, 185 feet in length, 35 feet in beam, drawing 14 feet, and having compound engines of 1200 horsepower. The Enterprise was replaced in 1909 by the U.S.S. Ranger, an iron gunboat, barkentine rigged, with steam engines. She was 177 feet long, with a 22 foot beam, and drew 14 feet. She had a wireless telegraph, submarine signal apparatus, a steam capstan, and steam steering gear all very modern for the time. Ranger's name was changed to Nantucket in 1918 and she remained in Academy service until 1942, when federal responsibility for state maritime academies was transferred from the Navy to the United States Maritime Commission. Her last name was Emery Rice.

In 1942, the Massachusetts Nautical School moved from Boston to Hyannis. Given the new name of Massachusetts Maritime Academy, it was based at the former Hyannis State Teachers College campus. For most of World War II, the usual two-year course was shortened to sixteen months; new classes arrived as soon as space was available. As in World War I, Academy graduates served bravely and effectively.

During World War II, Maritime Academy cadets took their training cruises on a variety of merchant ships. At the war's end, the United States Maritime Commission reinstated the practice of providing training vessels to state maritime academies, and Massachusetts received

the former Navy ship, U.S.S. Charleston, one of the last large gunboats. Built in 1936, she was 328 feet long, 41 feet in beam, and drew 13 feet. Oil fired boilers drove steam turbines developing 6,000 horsepower giving her a speed of up to 20 knots.

Acquiring a new Academy training ship meant a move from Hyannis in 1949, because Charleston's thirteen-foot draft was too much for Hyannis Harbor. The Maritime Academy's commissioners requested use of the State Pier at Buzzards Bay, where classrooms were made available. Berthing for the cadets was on the training ship. The Charleston was replaced by U.S.S. Doyen in 1957, renamed Bay State. She was a 415-foot-long, 60-foot-beam, 6,500-ton Navy attack transport with geared steam turbines (8500 h.p.) and a maximum of 18 knots

In 1964, legislation placed Massachusetts Maritime Academy within the Division of State Colleges of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Also in that year, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts authorized the Academy to grant Bachelor of Science degrees in Marine Transportation and Marine Engineering to cadets completing a four-year course of study.

Initial accreditation as a college was granted by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges in 1974 and was renewed in 1980, 1990 and 2001.

In 1977, the Academy admitted women. Women currently comprise approximately 10% of the student population.

The training ship, Patriot State, formerly the Santa Mercedes, served the Academy from 1985 to 1999, and was replaced in 2000 by the present training ship, Enterprise, formerly the Cape Bon. Enterprise, named in honor of the Academy's first training ship, is 540 feet in length with a 76 foot beam, and she draws 27 feet. Her geared steam turbines of 15,500 shaft horsepower, produce a speed of 20 knots.

Since 1990, the Academy's programs have been expanded to include Facilities and Environmental Engineering, Marine Safety and Environmental Protection, and International Maritime Business.
